






He highlighted the importance of being (our existence), then doing, having and then giving back to society.
















PHONE - A CURSE ?

Zealandia

Zealandia is the supposed missing 8th continent that was discovered after 375 years. In 2017, a team of eleven geologists from New Zealand, New Caledonia, and Australia concluded that Zealandia fulfils all the requirements to be considered a drowned continent. Part of the microcontinent is on the Australian plate, while the other part is on the Pacific plate. Zealandia is a long, narrow microcontinent that is mostly submerged in the South Pacific Ocean. A microcontinent is a landmass that has broken off from a main continent. Zealandia broke off from Antarctica about 100 million years ago and then from Australia about 80 million years ago. Zealandia is about half the size of Australia but only 7 percent of it is above sealevel. Zealandia generally enjoys a mild temperature change. Its largest islands have glaciers. The northern part of Zealandia is very volcanic. There are many natural geysers and hot springs scattered throughout Zealandia. The mountain ranges of Zealandia are slowly getting higher through a process called tectonic uplift. The submerged part of Zealandia is rich in mineral deposits although New Zealand's government strictly controls undersea mining activity. There are also many natural fields scattered throughout Zealandia. Underwater Zealandia is of value to science. During glacial periods, sea levels fell and more of Zealandia was abovewater. Zealandia's submerged fossils provide valuable clues to life during those time periods.

Kindness which is present within you never makes you feel lonely.



Back then I hated summer vacations because it stopped me from socializing.


Now I love every second of the break knowing that I'm better on my own.


