The exhibition was inaugurated by Principal, Dr. Anju Chopra.

The children of classes V to IX displayed interactive and innovative science projects in the exhibition. They also presented live scientific activities including a Helicopter activity based on Bernoullis theorem, hydraulic gate, Newton cradle etc.

The children also displayed hands on activities like volcano, puffer. lava lamp, coloured shadows, invisible ink etc.

It was exciting and wonderful to see the young scientific minds ready to lead the nation in future endeavours.

The effort of the children and their mentors in putting up such a grand show is really praiseworthy.

# NATIONAL SCIENCE DAY

On the occasion of National Science Day i.e. 28 February, 2025, the students of Class XI visited SGSITS Indore to witness practical demonstrations of advanced scientific concepts.

Faculty and researchers conducted engaging experiments, enhancing students' understanding of science and technology.

Key demonstrations included Laser Technology, Newton's Rings, Interference and Diffraction of Light, Standing Waves, and Semiconductors. Students observed Fuel Cell Working, Optical Fiber Sensors, Electron Gun, and the effects of Liquid Nitrogen.

Innovations like Holograms, an Advanced Blind Stick, and a Magnetic Levitation Pendulum showcased real-world applications of science.

This visit provided hands-on learning, bridging theoretical knowledge with practical applications, and inspiring students toward scientific exploration.



#### Visit to IIT Indore Talk by Prof. H.C. Verma

The visit to IIT, Indore on 28th
March, 2025 was a memorable
experience, highlighted by a
thought-provoking session by Prof.
H.C. Verma.

He shared his journey in Physics, emphasizing the role of experiments in learning and how curiosity drives scientific discovery.

He demonstrated simple yet powerful experiments, showing how hands-on experience enhances conceptual clarity.

Prof. Verma discussed the impact of AI in education, explaining how AI-based simulations can help visualize abstract Physics concepts and provide personalized learning.

He also stressed the importance of situational learning, where real-life scenarios help students understand theoretical concepts more effectively:





Another key lesson was the importance of observation and attention to detail.

He encouraged students to explore Physics in daily life, making learning more engaging and meaningful.

His approach to joyful learning emphasized that Physics is not about memorization but about understanding and discovery. Our students also interacted with IIT students, who shared valuable JEE preparation

strategies, including conceptual clarity, time management, and

consistent practice.

#### Inspiring Workshop by Padmashri Prof. H.C. Verma





The legendary physicist Padma Shri Prof. H.C. Verma conducted a workshop for Physics teachers on 29th March 2025. The session was a masterclass in experiential learning, where Prof. Verma captivated the audience with Physics experiments, demonstrating profound scientific principles using nothing more than simple household objects.

He emphasized that true learning goes beyond securing high marks—it is about developing a deep, conceptual understanding of the subject. He also introduced NAEST (National Anveshika Experimental Skill Test), a free platform for teachers and students, designed to foster a hands-on approach to Physics.

One of the most fascinating insights he shared was how everyday kitchen items can be utilized to illustrate fundamental concepts like moment of inertia, torque, and rotational dynamics. His innovative methods left the audience in awe, proving that Physics is all around us, waiting to be explored.

With around 80 educators from various schools across Indore in attendance, the workshop was not just an event—it was an eye-opening journey into the essence of scientific discovery.

The event was attended by Mr. Mohit Dubey (Vice Principal) and Mr. Kapil Jain (PGT Physics).

# Research on Mahakumbh

Kumbh is considered to be one of the most sacred and significant Hindu pilgrimage festival, held every 12 years. Mahakumbh 2025, a monumental event that had taken place in Prayagraj (formerly Allahabad), India, from 13th January to 26th February, 2025. This spectacular event is a celebration of spirituality, culture, and tradition, attracting millions of devotees, ascetics, and tourists from around the world.

As a step towards Research Based Learning, the children of class V were given a plethora of activities namely preparing interactive presentations, posters, paintings, drawings, and collages based on comprehensive research on the history, significance and cultural practices in Mahakumbh. 

#### Swirling Earth in a Bowl!

Our tiny explorers of Balvatika 2 turned into little scientists as they created a magical Earth using just milk, dish soap, and a splash of imagination!

#### Relating the Experiment to Earth:

The swirling patterns created by the blue and green food colouring in milk represent how Earth looks from space, with blue for oceans and green for land. As the colours mix and move, children can imagine how Earth is a living, dynamic planet -always changing and full of movement like the swirling seas and blowing winds.

This experiment shows how small actions (like a drop of soap) can cause big reactions, we teach children that small actions in real life—like taking care of nature—can make a big difference for our planet.
























Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vihar marked Earth Day on April 22nd,






