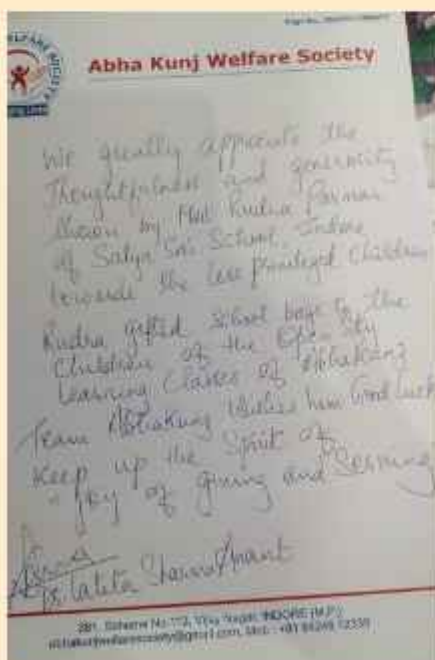

Aligning with CBSE's mission of organising awareness campaign for substance abuse, an interactive workshop was organised in school on 4th September, 2024 for the children of classes IX-XII to empower them with the knowledge and resilience needed to resist substance abuse.

The resource person Dr. Sudesh Sharda, renowned Laparoscopic surgeon apprised the children about the hazards of drug abuse in a very interesting and interactive session. Cleanliness is the cure that will last.

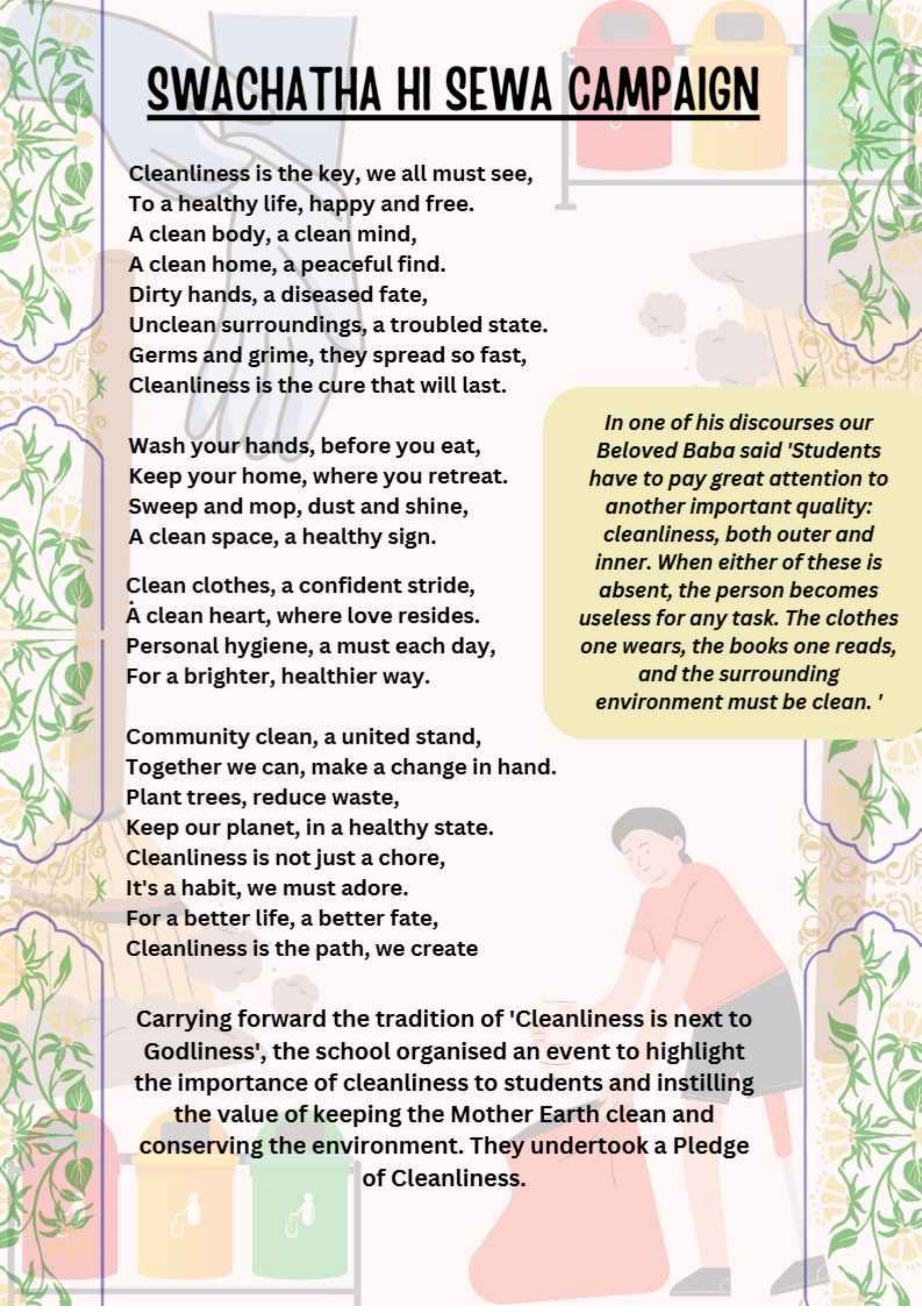

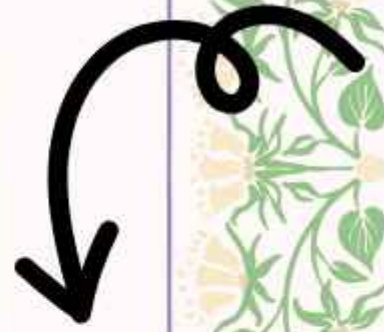


Role play
