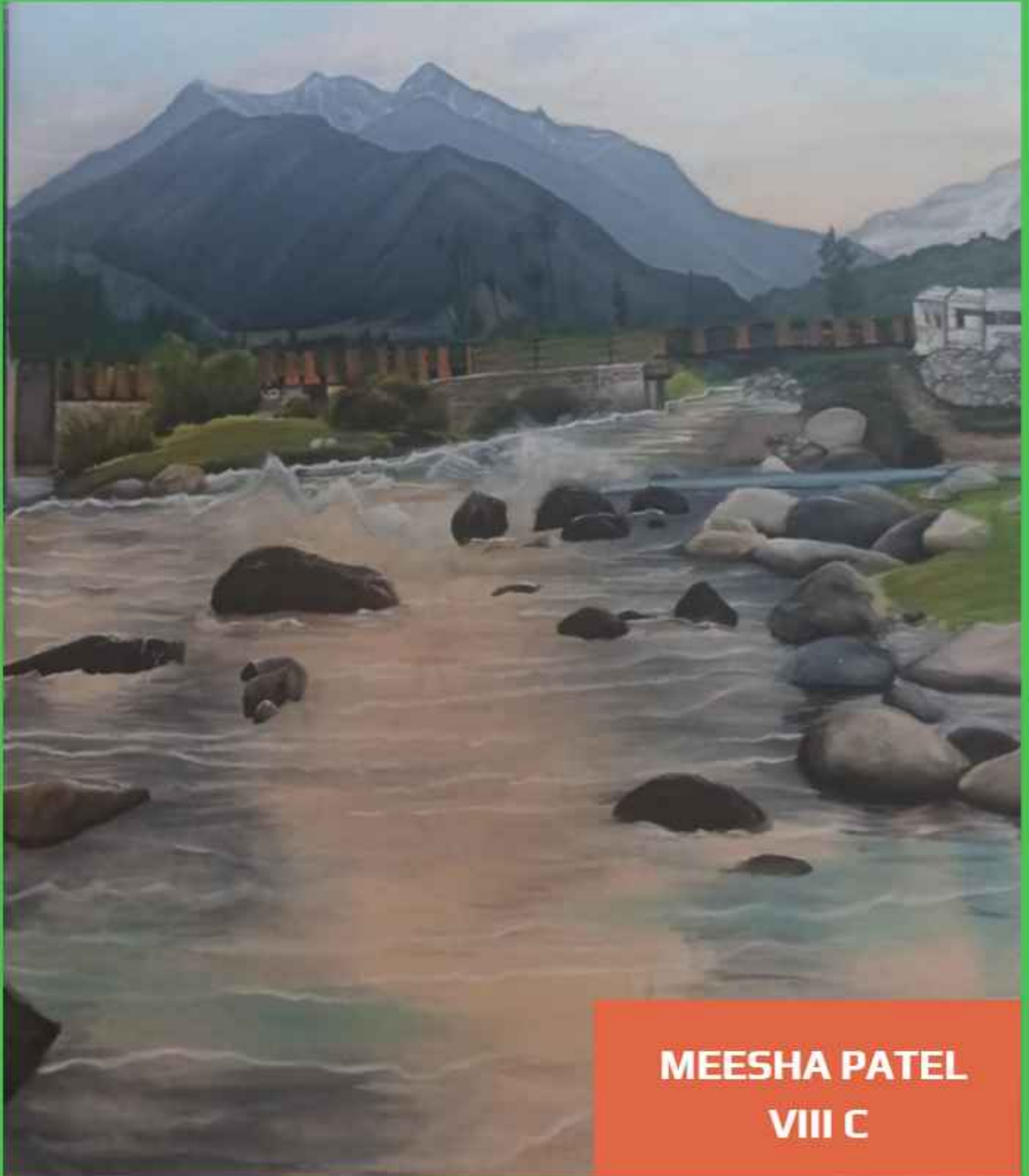

MAKING WATER REUSABLE



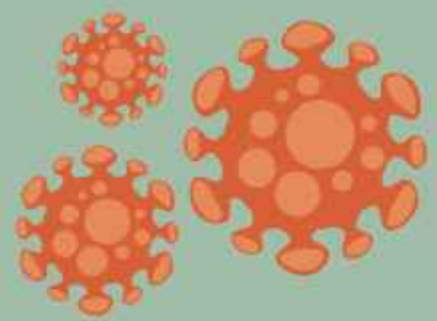
"Water is a gift from the creator, protect it, respect it"

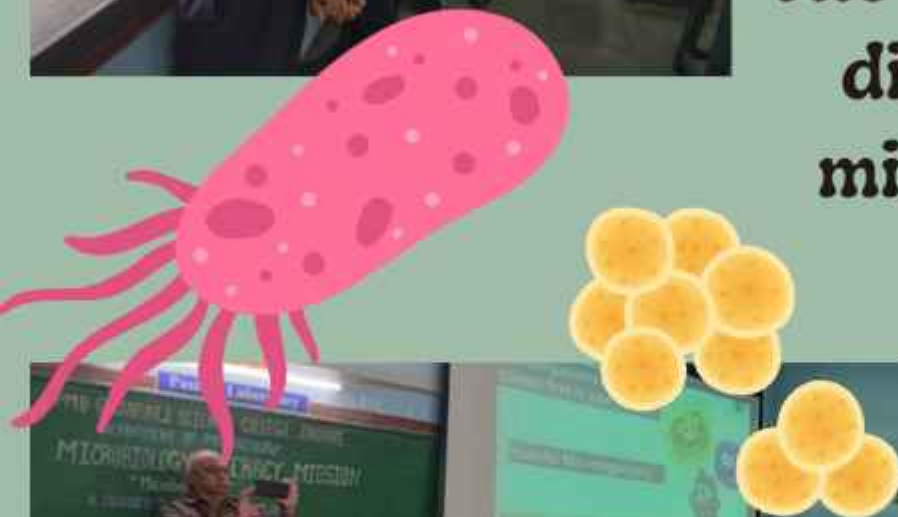

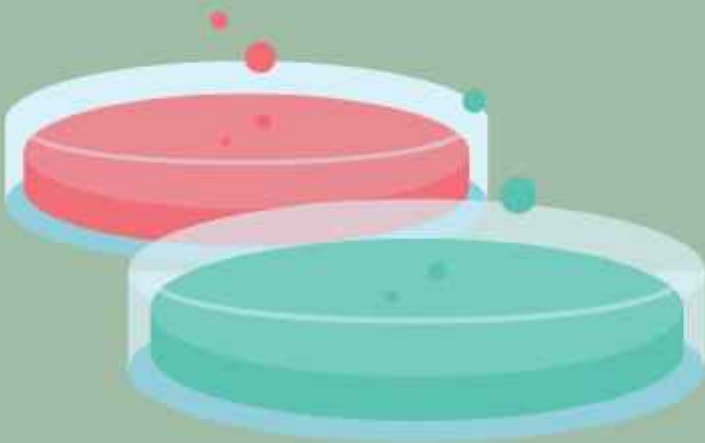
Glimpse into the Microbial World

India is a land of diverse flora and fauna. There are various species of plants that can be an asset in treating many diseases without any side effect.

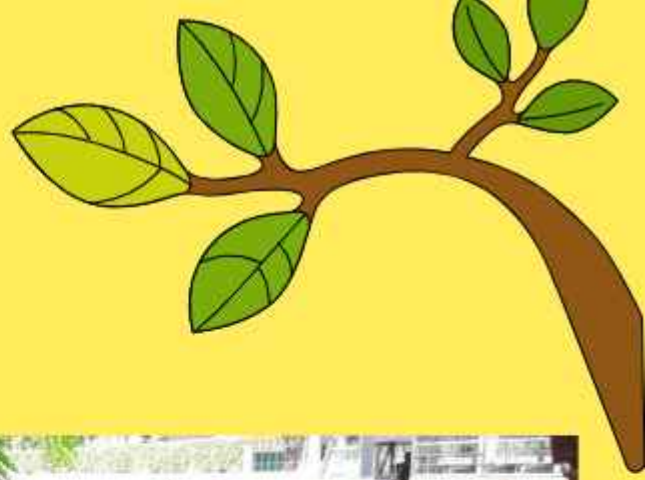

It was an awareness drive towards healthy living.



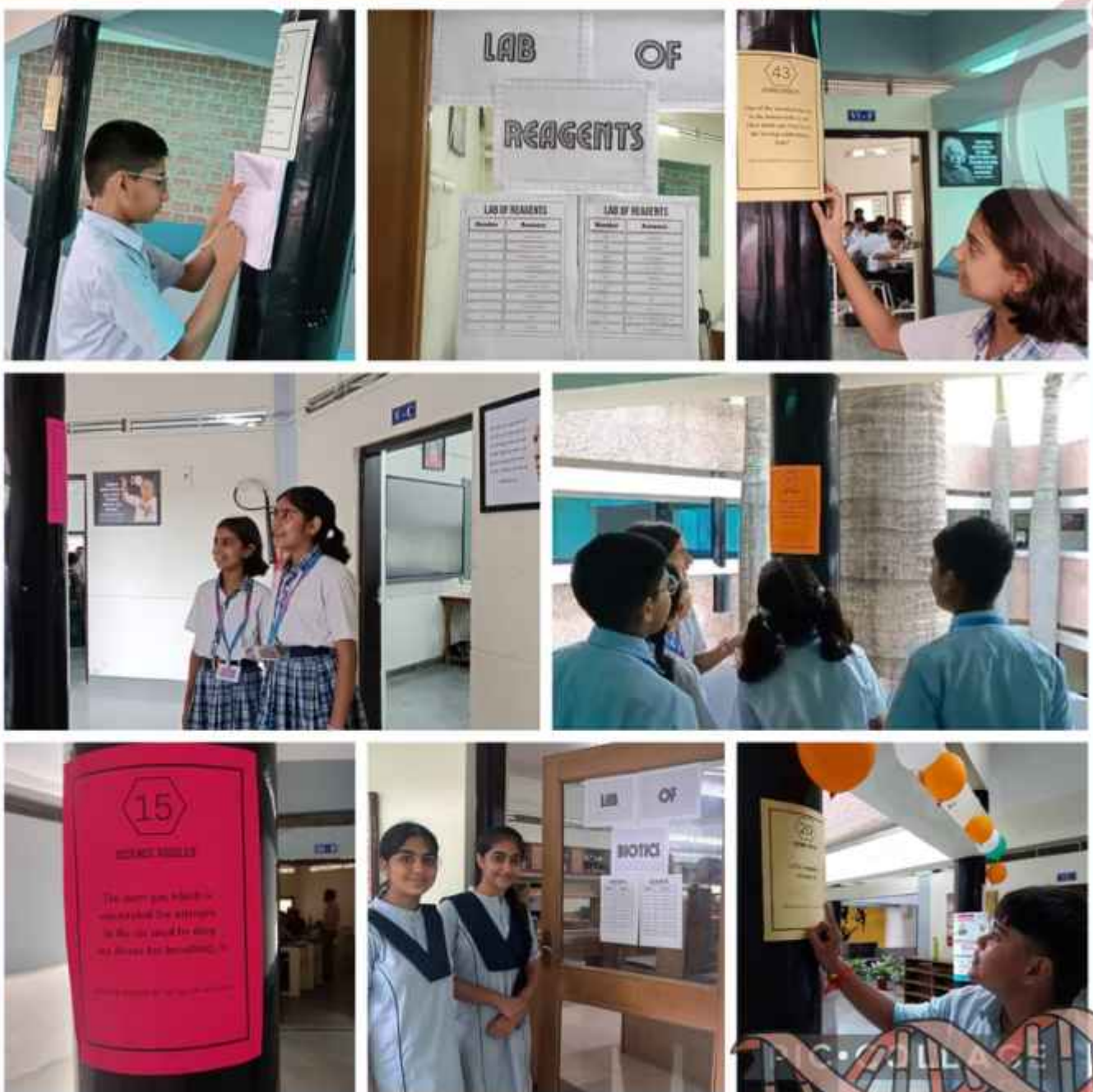
Tagging of Plants

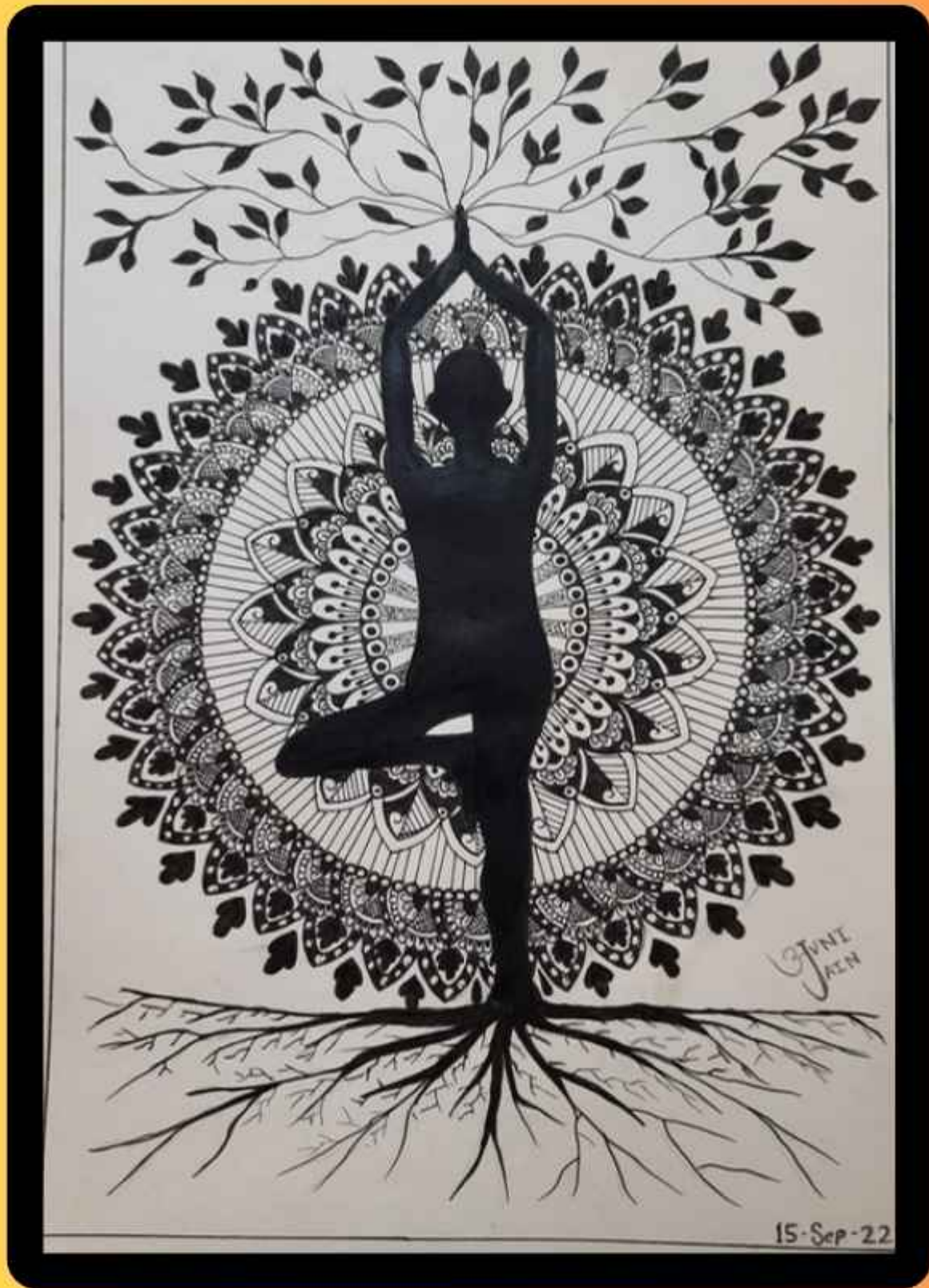
मेरी प्यारी मां, तुम हो अनमोल,
